You will be driven to developing student engagement and involvement in the wider life of the music department.

The ideal candidates will:

- be a passionate teacher and performer and a committed team player;
- plan and deliver inspiring instrumental lessons which allow students to make excellent progress;
- be an excellent communicator with pupils, staff and parents;
- be able to inspire pupils at both primary and secondary level;
- be an excellent performer; and
- contribute towards the music department through seeking out and delivering special opportunities to increase uptake and nurture those already learning.

Other Details

Teaching is part time, in term time only. The hours of work are dictated by the number of pupils requiring lessons. Currently we have 6.2 hours of teaching a week and it is hoped the successful candidates will be proactive in encouraging more pupils to start lessons. There may be opportunities to get involved with other music-making activities in the School.
